Tell us about your personal walk with Jesus Christ: As I choose to let go and let God's plans for me unfold, serving the family of Immanuel as a vestry member was not my vision. But as God often does, He has other plans. My walk with Him started as a very young child with a sickly grandfather, who knew the Lord well.
